Take your own tax deduction for donations to CAPRPAC

Many CAPR donors (over 500 to date) give to the Legal Fund but not to the PAC. Because Legal Fund donations can be deducted from your federal taxable income (with some restrictions that are explained below in the Legal Fund paragraph) the temptation is to give only to the Legal Fund.

Giving to the PAC may actually be more important than giving to the Legal Fund. Fighting in court over laws and rules that are already in effect is worthwhile but not nearly as effective as stopping the laws and rules from being made in the first place. In order to fight to get good candidates elected or good laws passed or bad laws stopped, we have to use after-tax political donations.

If offense makes more sense than defense to you, give to the PAC using the following table as a guide. Find your marginal tax rate by looking up your net taxable income in the first column. The second column shows your marginal tax rate for income above the net income shown. The third column shows how much tax savings you would get for \$100 donated to the CAPR Legal Fund. If you would rather donate the same out-of-pocket amount to the PAC just donate the amount in the fourth column. Either donation will affect your bottom line exactly the same.

** This table was prepared in December 2010 and is based on our best guess of what the actual rates will be in 2011 if Congress does nothing about the expiring rates. No matter what the rates are, the concept is the same.*

IRS deduction for donations to CAPR Legal Fund

Donations to the legal fund (not counting the value of any goods or services received) are tax deductible.

Deduction for membership fees to CAPR
